GROUP SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2025

This Group Statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our Group's slavery and human trafficking statement for the year ended 31 October 2025.

INTRODUCTION FROM THE CHAIRMAN

We are committed to combating slavery and human trafficking. Due to the nature of our business and the sector in which we operate, we believe that we are at a low risk of encountering or being exposed to slavery and human trafficking.

ORGANISATION'S STRUCTURE

We are a global provider of services in the ID, photo-kiosk, laundry and food sectors. We are the parent company of the Photo-Me International Group (Group). The Group had 1,133 employees worldwide as at 31 October 2025) and has a presence in 16 countries.

The Group had a global annual turnover of £317.2 million for the year ended 31 October 2025.

OUR BUSINESS

Our business is organised into four business units: identification, laundry, kiosks and, most recently, food. More information on each can be found in our annual report for the year ended 31 October 2025.

OUR SUPPLY CHAINS

Our supply chains include all the purchases of components, sub sets, finished products and services related to the Group's business.

OUR POLICIES ON SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business. Our Anti-slavery Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing

effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking are not taking place anywhere in our business or in our supply chains.

SUPPLIER ADHERENCE TO OUR VALUES

We have zero tolerance to slavery and human trafficking. To ensure all those in our supply chain and contractors comply with our values we have in place a supply chain compliance programme. This consists of:

- (i) reviewing compliance with all regulations and certifications; and
- (ii) researching potential suppliers through a pre-selection and selection processes which include:
 - proposed suppliers' agreeing to abide by ethical principles and the UN Global Compact;
 - visits to suppliers' premises and audits;
 - inserting provisions in our commercial contracts requiring suppliers to adhere to ethical principles and observe anti-slavery legislation.

STEPS TAKEN THIS YEAR

No new steps were taken this year; however, we continue to have a robust anti-slavery policy in place and standard form contracts which seek to protect against slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain. We do not tolerate any instances of slavery and human trafficking in any form whatsoever in our business or in our supply chain.

On 15 January 2026, the board of directors of the Company approval this statement subject to the inclusion of certain data from the audited accounts for the year ended 31 October 2025 and authorised the Chairman to sign it.
